This will allow us to modify our new building in Tucson and to accommodate the accessibility needs of our students and staff while providing additional security for clients when they are on the property. This building provides additional space for Saavi to provide training for youth and adults, including a braille library, computer labs, and dedicated kitchens for living skills. While the extra space allows us to expand our programming, aspects of the building remain inaccessible for people who are blind. With funding we will relocate the lobby from the second floor to the first floor and widen the door to the main entrance and install a sliding door to make it wheelchair accessible. We will also install a new, updated elevator car as our current elevator lacks braille to indicate floor levels and the door sensors are not equipped to detect canes or other assistive devices. There are twenty-four exterior doors to the outside. To ensure the safety of the building and our clients, funding will allow Saavi to purchase and install electronic locks controlled by an app accessible to people who are blind, automatic accessible door openers for the exterior courtyard doors, accessible electronic door locks, two automatic drive-through gates and four call boxes for the property.
