Non-Title XIX SMI



Not Eligible for AHCCCS? You may still be eligible for services.

Adults with a Serious Mental Illness (SMI) designation, and children designated with a Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED), are eligible to receive a number of medically necessary mental health and/or substance use services, even if they are not eligible for AHCCCS. These individuals are often referred to as Non-Title XIX SMI or Non-Title XXI SED.

Funding for these services is provided through the State of Arizona and grants.

Examples of these services include, but are not limited to:

- residential treatment,
- · medication,
- counseling.
- · case management,
- supportive housing,
- traditional healing,
- · crisis services and,
- · supportive services.



Services are limited by the availability of funds.

If you are an adult with a SMI in need of behavioral health treatment, or the parent of a child in need of SED services and treatment, and are currently not eligible for AHCCCS, contact your health plan or a Regional Behavioral Health Agreement (see the other side of this page). Individuals with a SMI designation may also be eligible to receive services through the Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD) or the Arizona Long-Term Care System (ALTCS).
