SED Identification

- Qualifies children & adolescents for additional funding through the Mental Health Block Grant (MHBG) if they are uninsured or underinsured
- Not a diagnosis
- Must meet eligibility criteria to be identified




SED Identification Eligibility Criteria

Under 18 years old Qualifying Diagnosis*

Serious **Functional Impairment**

CALOCUS Score of 2 - 6**







^{*}As identified by AHCCCS Medical Coding

^{**}CALOCUS is not required for Fee for Service (FFS) members, TRBHAs, or children under 6 years old



Qualifying Diagnosis

Qualifying Diagnosis include, but are not limited to:

- Anxiety Disorders
- Bipolar & Depressive Disorders
- Conduct Disorders & ADHD
- Schizophrenia Spectrum & other Psychotic Disorders
- Trauma & Stressor Related Disorders
- Obsessive Compulsive & Related Disorders
- Dissociative Disorders
- Somatic Symptom & Related Disorders
- Feeding & Eating Disorders

Overview of Changes

Previous	Current
Solari was the contracted vendor for SED determinations from 10/01/23-03/27/25.	Effective 03/28/25, no longer contracted as a result of the federal government's ARPA grant terminations.
Providers completed assessment packet and sent to Solari via their portal.	Providers complete a secure Microsoft Form: SED Identification and Removal Request Form.
CALOCUS encouraged, but optional.	CALOCUS required (0-6, or 99 if 5 and under). SED identification is for those members with CALOCUS 2-6.
Solari shared results with provider.	Results no longer shared with providers, but they can check AHCCCS Online for the code change to "Z".
SED Determination, with grievances and appeals process through Solari.	SED Identification, with grievances and appeals process through general member issues at AHCCCS.



Step 1: Call to ask for an SED evaluation

Current SED Identification Process

Step 2: An evaluation is required to occur no later than seven (business) days after a request is made.

Step 3: The individual meets with a qualified clinician.

Step 4: The clinician completes the AHCCCS SED Identification & Removal Request Form

Step 5 - AHCCCS will complete the identification within three business days.

SED Identification & Removal Request Form

The evaluating provider will submit a request form with the following information:

- Requester Name & Provider
- Member first and last name
- Member DOB
- Member AHCCCS ID*
- Qualifying Diagnosis
- CALOCUS Score
- Health Plan & Enrollment Date
- Effective Date (date of the assessment or removal)

*Members MUST have an open enrollment for AHCCCS to update SED Z code in PMMIS

Looking Ahead – SED Identification Process

Beginning 10/01/2025, providers will be required to input SED information into the DUGless portal, similar to the request form.

- The DUGless portal will update the Behavioral Health code from Child (C) to SED (Z) and will be shared with Health plans. Health plans will communicate with member's family/caregivers and assign health homes.
- Providers will be unable to submit if the member does not have active enrollment with AHCCCS.
- The DUGless training guide will be updated and available as a resource.



Step 1: Call to ask for an SED evaluation

SED Identification Starting 10/01/2025

Step 2: An evaluation is required to occur no later than seven (business) days after a request is made.

Step 3: The individual meets with a qualified clinician.

Step 4: The clinician uploads member information to the DUGless portal.

Step 5 - The BH Code will be changed in PMMIS to reflect "Z" for SED if the member meets criteria for SED.

2025 Legislative Session Timeline

- Mon. January 13th- Start of Legislative Session.
- January to March Regular committees
- April to June Budget negotiations, non-regular committees, floor voting.
- June 27th Legislature Adjourns Sine Die!
- Next session will begin on the second Monday of the calendar year.

Legislative Highlights

- Agency Bills/Initiatives:
 - SB 1671 Traditional healing services; AHCCCS
- Additional bills of note- signed into law (not all inclusive)
 - HB 2945 DD; appropriations; waivers
 - SB1132 AHCCCS; continuous glucose monitors
 - SB1711 AHCCCS; obesity treatment; study committee
 - HB2332 Postpartum health; education; advisory committee



AHCCCS Bills/Budget Provisions (not all inclusive)

SB1735- general appropriations act; 2025-2026

- Continues Funding for Medicaid enterprise system (MES) modernization.
- Continues Graduate Medical Education (GME) and Critical Access Hospital (CAH) funding.
- Directs AHCCCS to produce an implementation plan that contains recommendations for Secure Behavioral Health facilities (SBHRFs) and issue a request for proposals (RFP) for SBHRF funding.

SB1741- health care; 2025-2026

- Adds cochlear implants and speech therapy services for adults covered by AHCCCS.
- Adds Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy to the State's newborn screening panel.
- Authorizes and funds Traditional Healing services through or by IHS or tribal facility as a covered service to AHCCCS members who qualify.
- Authorizes limited prerelease services as AHCCCS-covered benefits for incarcerated individuals.

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
