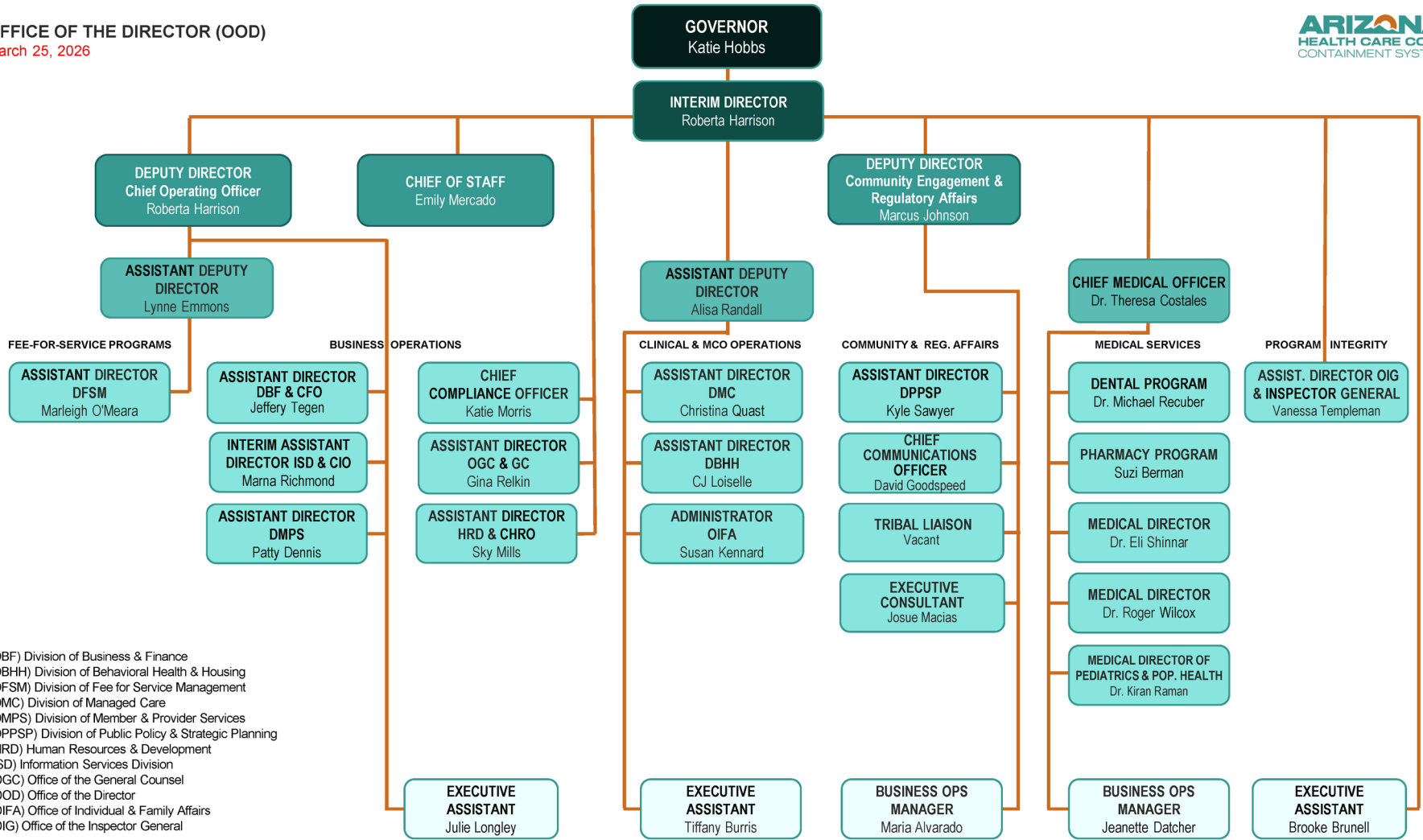

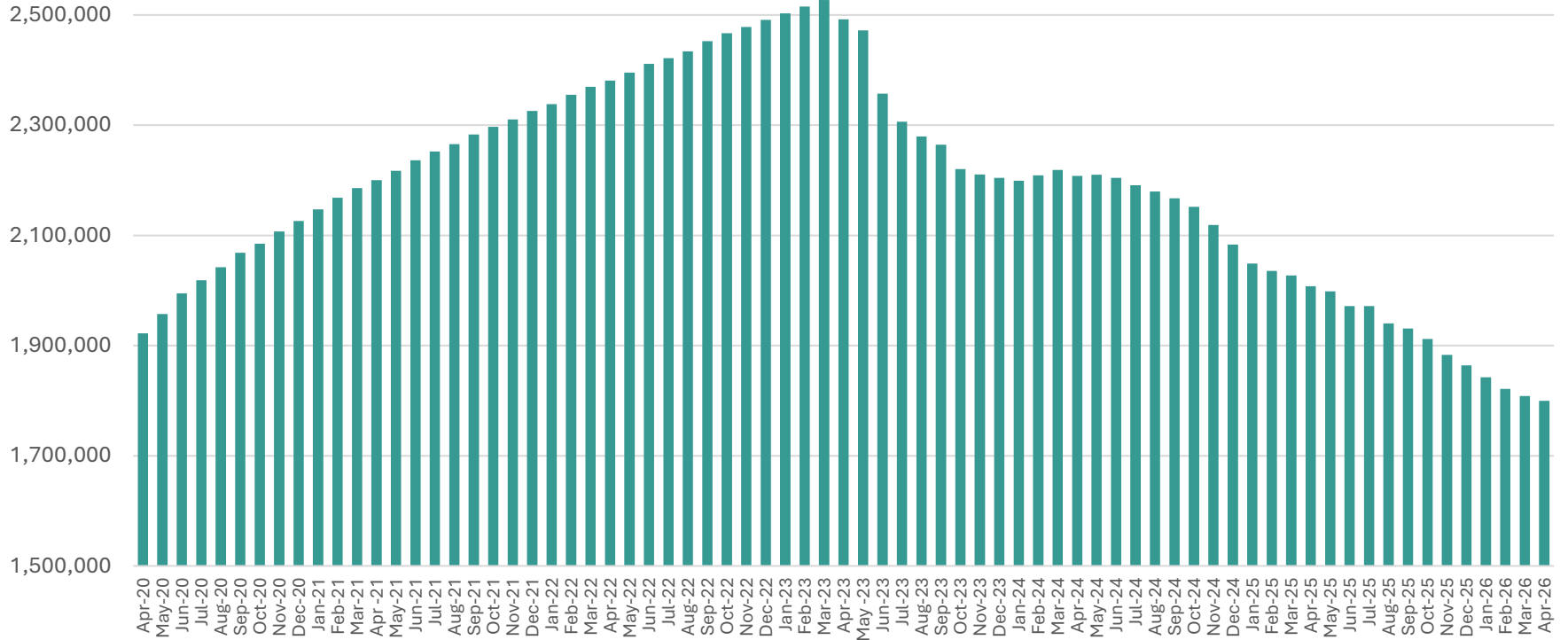

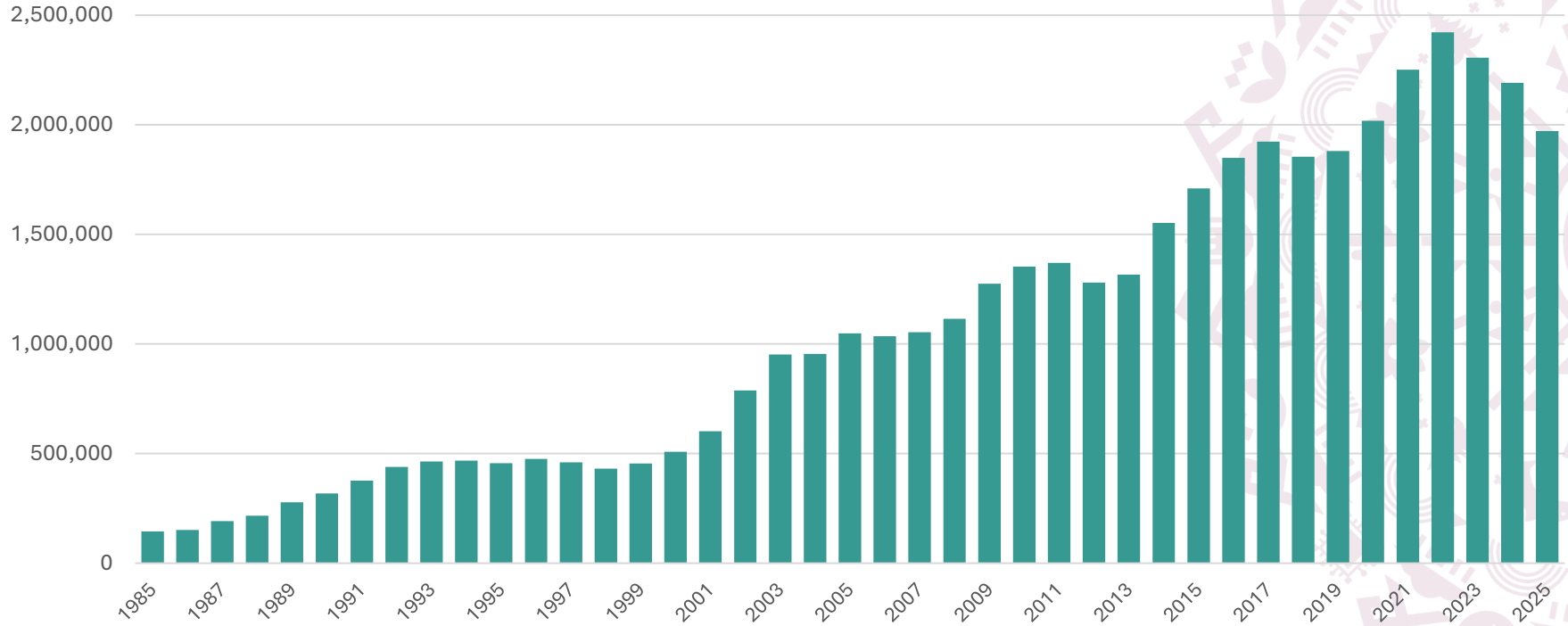

Since We Last Met...

- Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) and H.R.1 Websites went live (*more to come later today*)
- Legislative Session in progress, Additional AHCCCS Oversight Hearing
- Announced the upcoming public forums (*more to come later today*):
 - Home and Community Based Services/Extraordinary Care Review (HNT/ECR)
 - Applied Behavior Analysis Services (ABA)
 - Arizona Long Term Care System Elderly/Physically Disabled (ALTCS EPD) Program
- AHCCCS Health Plans announced an additional \$2.5 million investment in affordable housing across the state through the Housing is Healthcare Fund
- Fee-for-service behavioral health provider engagement continues, more trainings being offered, claims turnaround times are decreasing

H.R. 1 – Key Implementation Dates

- Rural Health Transformation Program – 12/31/25
- Community Engagement/Work Requirements – 12/31/26
- 6-month Eligibility Redeterminations – 12/31/26
- Hospital Assessment Implications – Phase down by 2032
- Cost Sharing Changes – 10/1/28
- Administrative Costs for Implementation and Operations – 2026
Legislative Session
- **IMPORTANT:** No immediate changes to AHCCCS member coverage



H.R. 1 – Implementation Costs

- AHCCCS Budget Proposal contains information on the first year implementation costs associated with H.R.1
 - \$71.4 million total fund increase, \$18.8 million general fund increase
 - 320 additional FTEs required

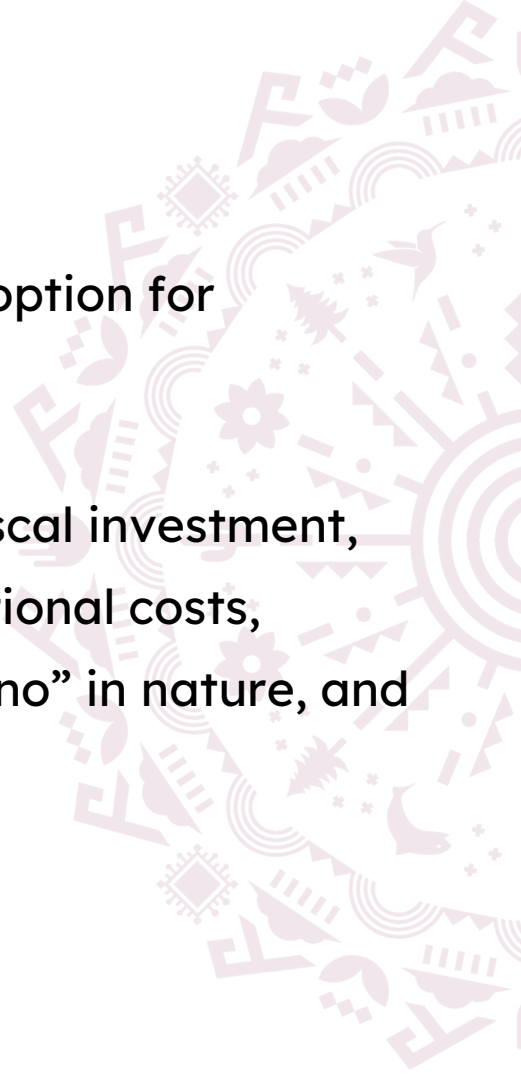
DAP Background

- Since 2016, Differential Adjusted Payments (DAPs) have been used to incentivize providers that commit to actions aimed at:
 - Enhancing the patient care experience
 - Improving member health outcomes
 - Reducing the overall cost of care
- DAPs are positive adjustments to the AHCCCS Fee Schedule, and health plans are required to pass these increases through to their contracted provider rates.
- AHCCCS leverages DAPs to advance policy objectives and support public health initiatives.
- DAPs are currently available to a wide range of provider types, including:
 - Inpatient and outpatient hospitals
 - Outpatient clinics
 - Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) providers
 - Nursing facilities
 - Dental providers



DAP Standards

- Designed as a short-term initiative (one year), with option for extension,
- Incentivizes a behavior change,
- Requires community impact to be proportional to fiscal investment,
- Not intended to subsidize or replace ongoing operational costs,
- Structured with clear quantifiable criteria and “yes/no” in nature, and
- Auditable.

 - Maternal Syphilis Program
 - Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) Program
- **Extended Training Opportunities**
 - Wraparound training for clinics providing high-needs case management
 - Child and Family Team (CFT) facilitation training
- **Information Sharing Participation**
 - Closed Loop Referral System (CLRS)
 - Health Information Exchange (HIE)
 - Electronic Visit Verification (EVV)
