Independent Provider Program

- The AHCCCS Tribal Independent Provider Workgroup met the goal of phasing out the Independent Provider Program while ensuring continuity of member care.
- As of January 1, 2015 there were no reports of gaps in attendant care services to members as a result of this phase out. Direct Care Service Agencies are now providing attendant care services.
 - There were a total of 264 IPs
 - 222 were hired by Direct Care Service Agencies
 - 42 IPs chose not to transition
