

Special Tribal Consultation Meeting: FY23 Differential Adjusted Payment

January 31, 2022



Differential Adjusted Payment (DAP) Background

- Used since 2017 to incentivize providers that have committed to supporting actions that improve patients' care experience, improve members' health and reduce cost of care growth.
 - AHCCCS uses DAPs to promote policy goals:
 - participation in information sharing systems like the Social Determinant of Health Closed Loop Referral System or participating in the Health Information Exchange (HIE)
 - specific policies such as physicians using electronic Rx or provision of dental services on weekends
 - DAPs are time-limited and expire at the end of the fiscal year



Proposed FY23 IHS/Tribal 638 Facility DAPs

- Health Information Exchange (HIE) Participation (up to 2.5%)
 - IHS/638 Hospitals that meet specified milestones and performance criteria are eligible for a 2.5% DAP increase for inpatient, outpatient, and ambulatory services.
 - In order to qualify, by April 1, 2022 the hospital must submit a Letter of Intent (LOI) to the HIE
 - Agree to meet milestones for data quality standards
 - If file an LOI but fail to meet milestones will be ineligible for a DAP in FY24, if that DAP is available in FY24



FY23 IHS/Tribal 638 Facility DAPs (cont.)

- Care Coordination Agreement (CCA) with Non-IHS/Tribal 638 Facilities (0.5%)
 - In order to qualify, by March 15, 2022, the IHS/638 hospital must submit LOI
 - By April 30, 2022, the IHS/638 hospital must submit fully signed CCA
 - The CCA with a non-IHS/Tribal 638 facility must be for inpatient, outpatient, and ambulatory services provided through a referral
- Non-IHS/Tribal 638 Facilities to enter into CCA with IHS/Tribal 638 Facilities (0.5%)
 - The non-IHS/Tribal 638 hospitals have the same DAP for entering into a CCA with an IHS/Tribal 638 facility



FY23 Behavioral Health Outpatient Clinic and Integrated Clinic DAPs

- Provision of Services to Members in a Difficult to Access Location (3.0%)
 - Clinics that provide services to members in a difficult to access location will qualify for a DAP increase of 3.0% on all claims.
 - Provision of services is defined as a provider that has a MOA or MOU with a tribal government to access tribal territory in order to provide behavioral health services to members located in the Grand Canyon.
 - In order to qualify, by April 1, 2022 the Clinic must submit a signed MOA or MOU to AHCCCS at the following email addresses:

Proposed DAP Changes for Other Providers

Including, but not limited to:

- HIE Participation
 - Along with IHS/638 Hospitals, increasing level of participation required for Nursing Facilities, Integrated Clinics, and Behavioral Health Outpatient Clinics
 - Assisted Living Centers and Physicians, PAs and NPs in certain specialities begin HIE participation by signing LOI to begin accessing HIE data
- Partnership with Schools
 - BH Outpatient Clinics and Integrated Clinics eligible if they participate and receive referrals from schools under Universal Educational Referral System
- Arizona Health Directives Registry
 - Non-IHS/638 hospitals are mandated to initiate connectivity



Proposed DAP Changes for Other Providers With Focus on APRA HCBS

- Social Determinants of Health Closed Loop Referral System
 - Home and Community Based Services providers are to begin receiving DAP for CLRS participation
- Therapeutic Foster Homes
 - New and Continuing TFHs
- Training Requirements
 - Certain clinics and habilitation providers to receive DAP for training staff
- Workforce Development
 - Improved workforce development metrics


