# Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS)

Recap of Day One



#### AHCCCS **Potential** Solutions

#### AHCCCS is seeking feedback on the following:

- Requiring proof of tribal membership or IHS eligibility to enroll in AIHP,
- Removing the phone option for AIHP enrollment changes unless proof of IHS eligibility is on record,
- Freezing enrollment changes to AIHP unless proof of IHS eligibility is provided or on record,
- Exploring tribally-operated MCOs,
- Re-creating the Covered Behavioral Health Services Guide,
- Conducting data pulls for populations served and utilization, and/or
- Setting max limits for each code and requiring PA for anything above the limit.



#### **Common Themes**

- Meaningful tribal engagement
  - Tribal liaison to visit all regions of the state
  - Tribal involvement in AHCCCS policy development process
- General consensus that some documentation should be required for AIHP enrollment
  - Suggested documents include: Tribal ID, descendancy letter/verification, CIB, mirroring IHS standards, affidavit of birth, verification from BIA, tribal business license.
  - Need to ensure this doesn't pose a barrier to care for vulnerable, accept documentation that will work for each tribe, consider a waiver process while members are retrieving tribal documents.
  - Need to establish partnerships with DES, Census Offices, CHW/CHRs



#### **Common Themes**

- Establish a public list of reputable providers
- Increase care coordination and case management for rural FFS populations
- Increase vetting of providers
  - Random site visits
- Increased Transparency by AHCCCS
  - More granular, frequent data pulls
- Increased culturally competent care and collaboration with tribes on best practices
- Need to be mindful of unintended increased burden on members, tribes and providers
  - Existing lack of resources in rural communities
  - Tribes should not be punished for the actions of bad actors



#### **Actions**

- AHCCCS will continue to evolve tribal consultation format
- AHCCCS will explore how to further involve tribes in the policy development process
- AHCCCS will propose a list of tribal documents for enrollment in AIHP for tribes to evaluate and discuss at the next TC
- AHCCCS will evaluate what can be published regarding a registry of providers
- AHCCCS will schedule a follow up TC specific to this issue
- AHCCCS will implement increased vetting for problematic provider types
- AHCCCS will continue to pull data and update the tribes on what is going well and what is not
- AHCCCS will recreate the BH services guide

# Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) Recap of Day One



#### ADHS **Potential** Solutions

- Eliminate ownership loopholes
- Increase fine limits in statute
- Require fine payment with annual licensing fee
- Monitoring fee for non-compliant licensees
- Eliminate inspection loopholes
- More Stringent Requirements for BHRFs
- Remove SLH confidentiality
- Funding for electronic systems
- Funding for additional staff



#### **Common Themes**

- Meaningful tribal consultation:
  - Collaboration and education with TRBHA/tribes
- Need for increased oversight:
  - o More frequent site visits, random site visits, leverage TRBHA criteria for site visits, evaluate BHRF/SLHs closer to the reservation
  - Limiting number of facilities a BHP can be affiliated with and how many BHTs a BHP can oversee
- More thorough vetting of providers applying for a license:
  - Verify physical address
  - Background checks/fingerprint clearance cards



#### **Common Themes**

- Enforce and increase fines:
  - Higher fines, suspend provider license if not paid
  - Create an inability to renew license if fines not paid
- Website search engine for facilities works well, but needs to be expanded
- Open statute/rule to implement needed changes.
  - Expedite if possible
- Require accreditation for select providers; consider a rating/scoring system to assess quality of providers
- Close loopholes proposed by ADHS <u>as well as the SLH/IC/77 partnership</u> loophole
- Monitor ownership and address changes more closely
  - Requirement to report changes



#### **Actions**

- ADHS will include TRBHA/tribal leaders in communications plan for tribal focused announcements.
- ADHS will schedule a follow-up with TRBHA to discuss collaboration and education requested.
- ADHS will continue to conduct tribal connects across Arizona
- ADHS will continue to involve tribes in discussions on future policy changes that have the potential to impact the tribal communities or tribal members in the state of Arizona
- ADHS will work on next steps to move forward with proposed policy changes


