



APS Can

<u>Report</u>

- Abuse
- Neglect (including Self-Neglect)
- Exploitation

Evaluate

- Protective services
- Request medical and financial records when appropriate

Refer

- To other agencies
- To the Public Fiduciary



APS Cannot

Remove an adult from their home

Require an adult to accept services.

Make financial decisions.

Serve as a guardian.


Interfere in a capacitated adult's lifestyle.




Information Sharing

CONFIDENTIALITY AND CROSS-REPORTING

A.R.S. § 46-460





A. Unless otherwise provided by law, all personally identifying information concerning any person who is involved in an adult protective services program, including the reporting source's identity, other than a perpetrator against whom an allegation of abuse, neglect or exploitation has been substantiated pursuant to section 46-458, and all information that is gathered or created by adult protective services and that is contained in adult protective services records is confidential and may not be released except as provided in subsections B, C and D of this section.



During an investigation APS is authorized to share the information:

- During Supreme Court Proceedings
- With law enforcement
- With partner agencies





During an investigation APS is authorized to share the information:

- During pre-approved judicial proceedings
- With subdivisions of state and tribal governments





During an investigation APS is authorized to share the information when there is an agreement in place, it has been approved by the director, or in other extenuating circumstances.
