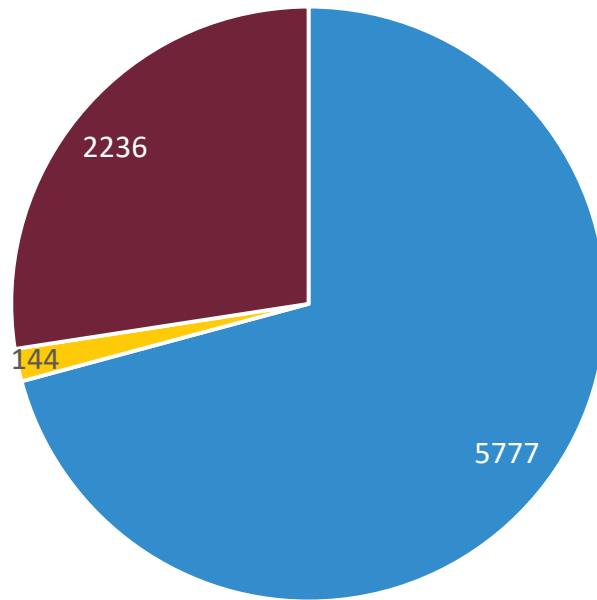

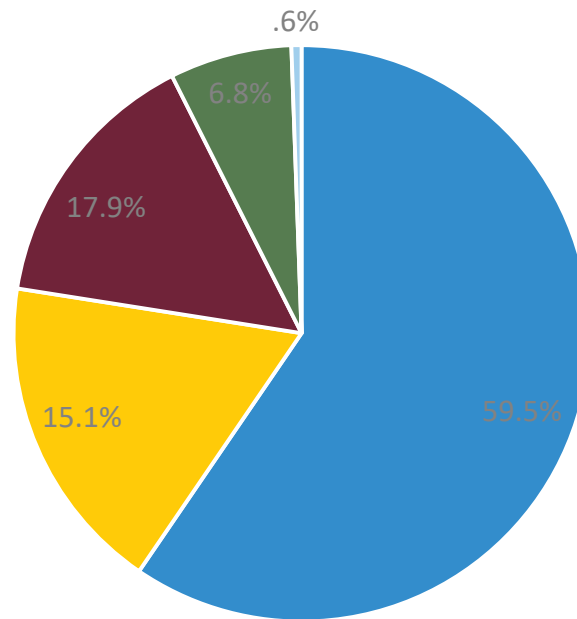

Living Situation – Prior to Enrollment

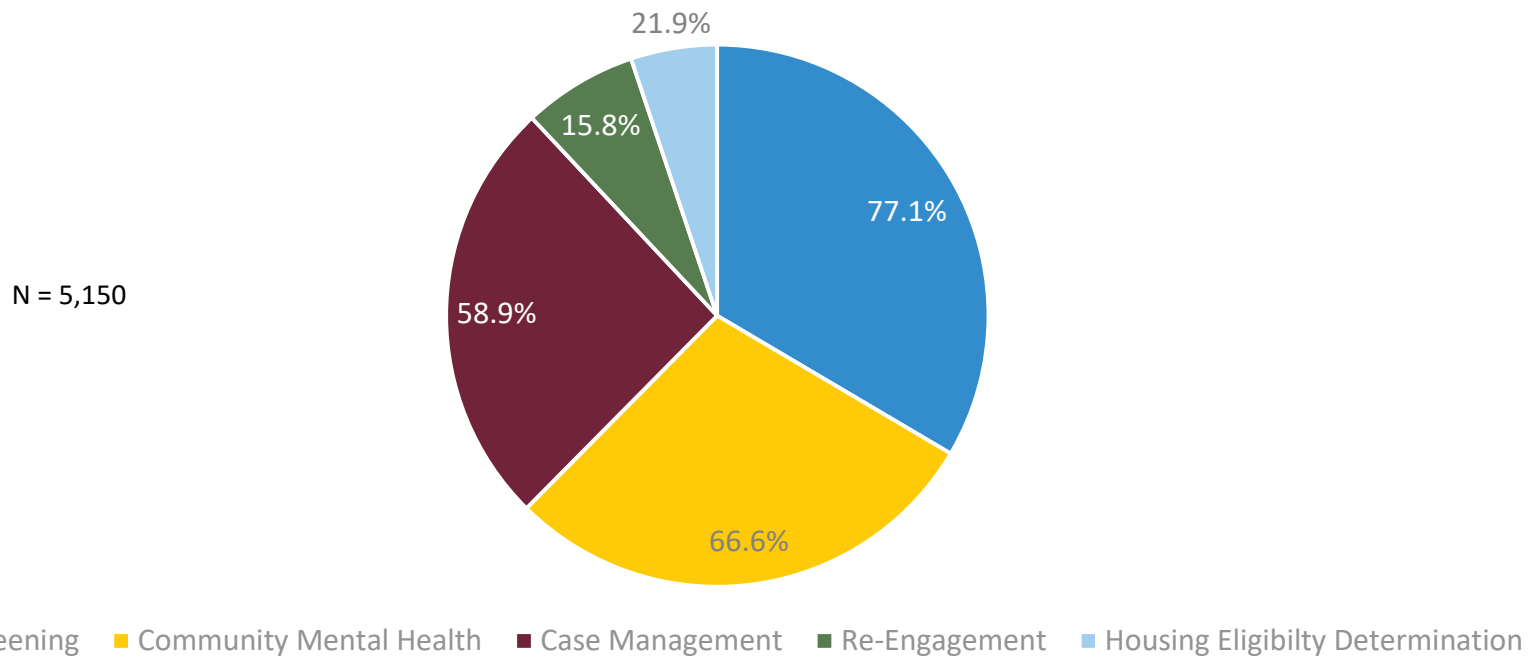

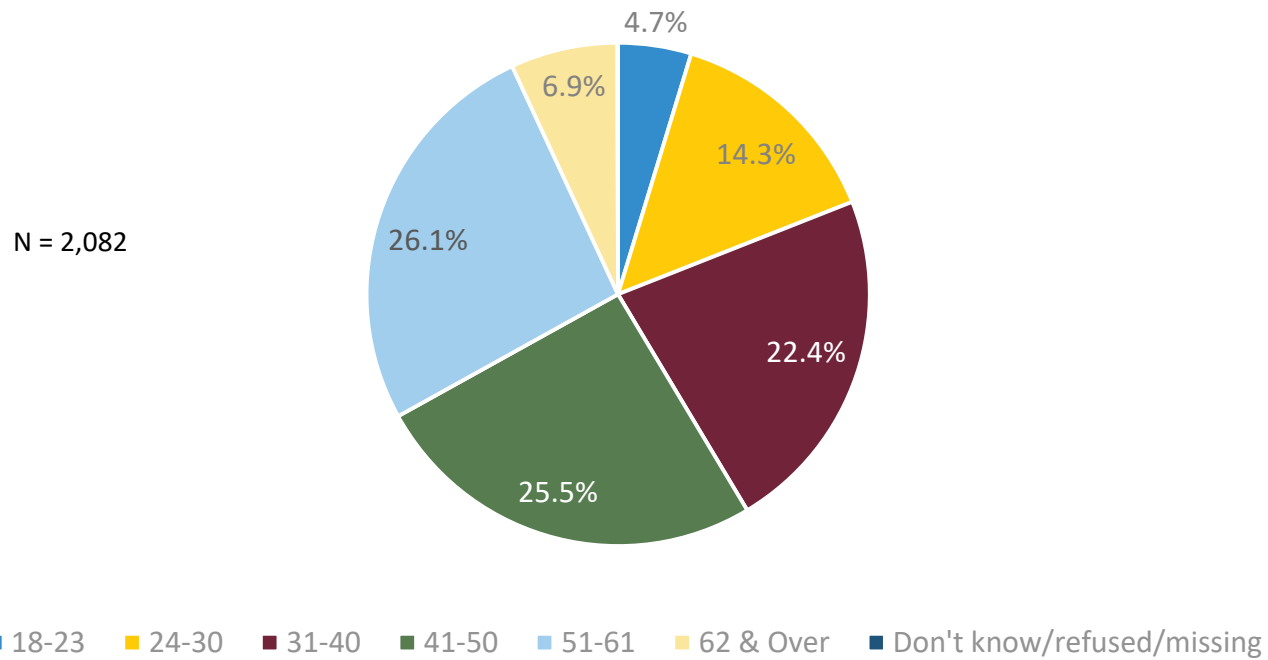

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Highest Percentage of Services

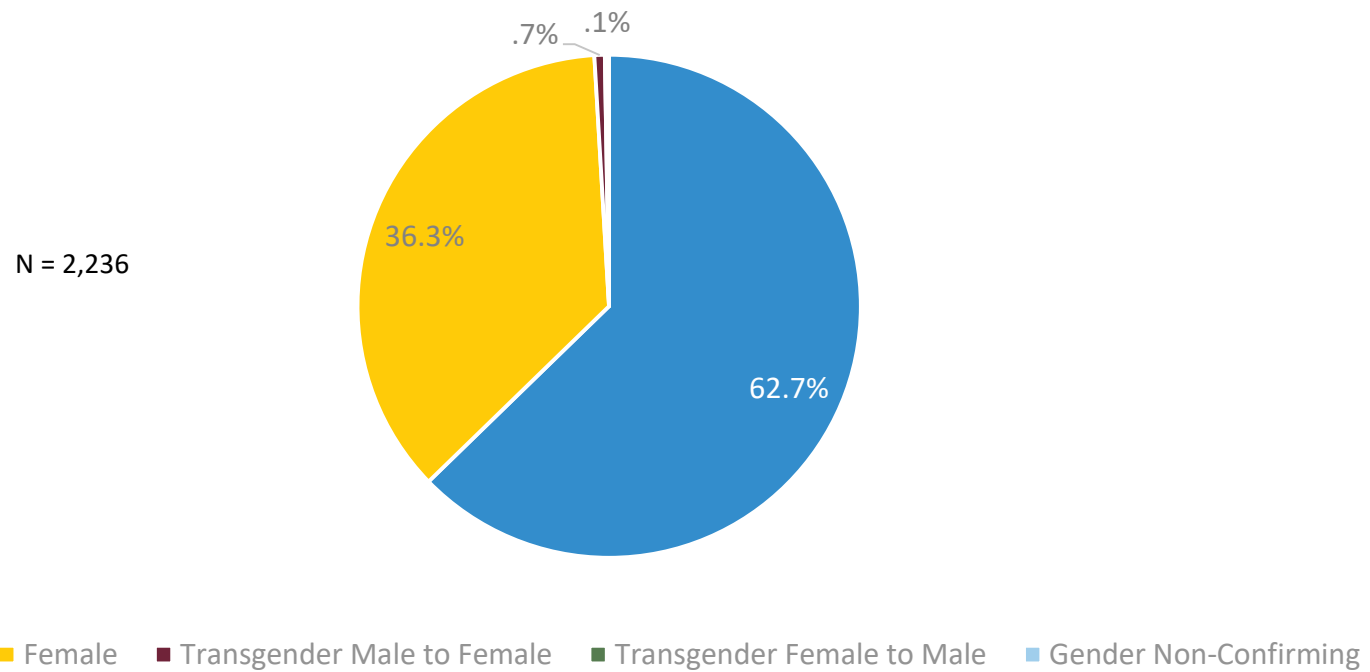


PATH Enrollee Demographics - Age



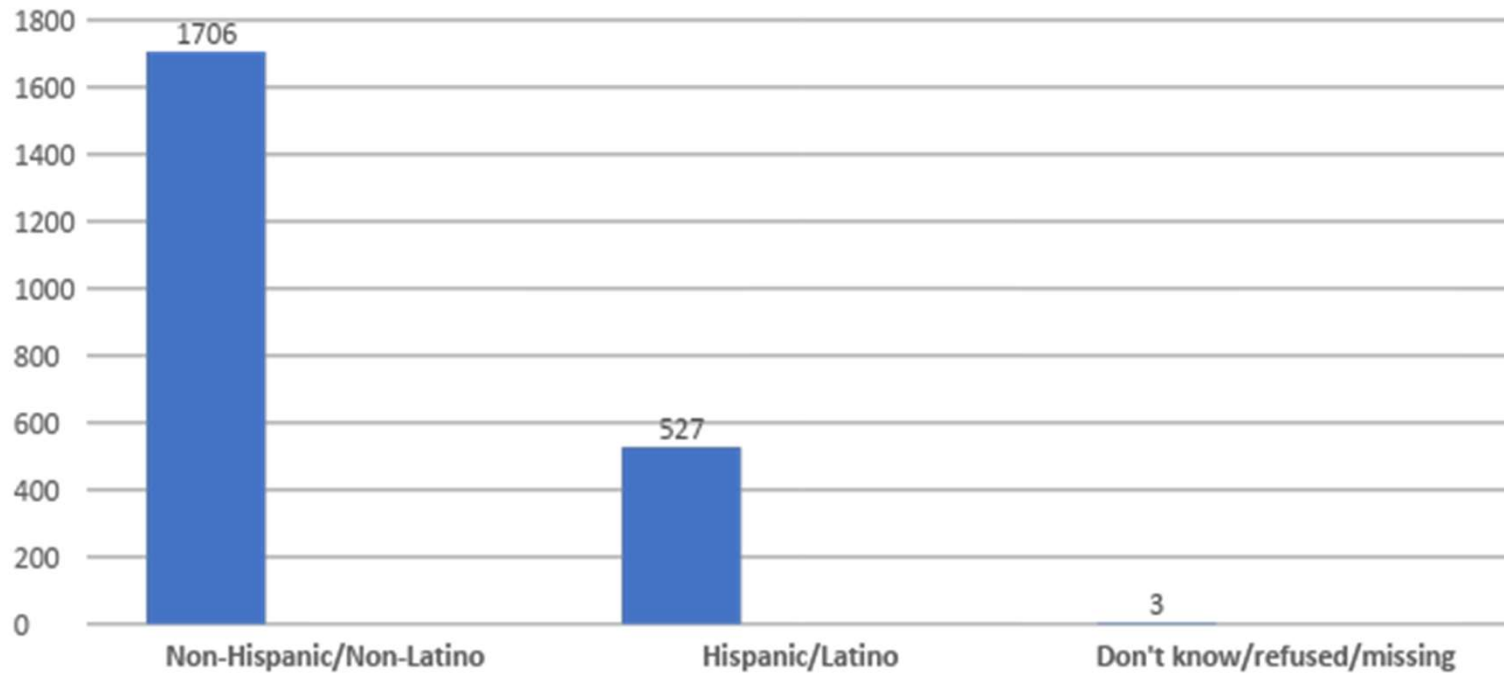

PATH Enrollee Demographics - Gender



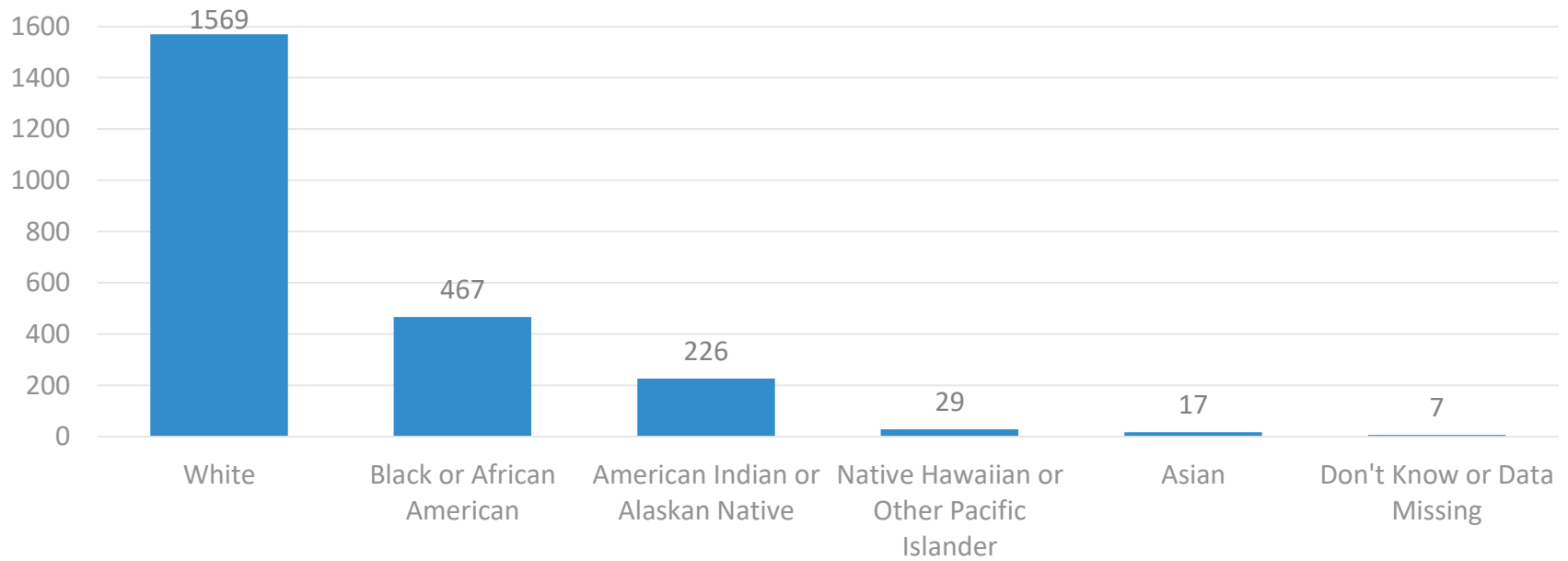

PATH Enrollee Demographics - Ethnicity



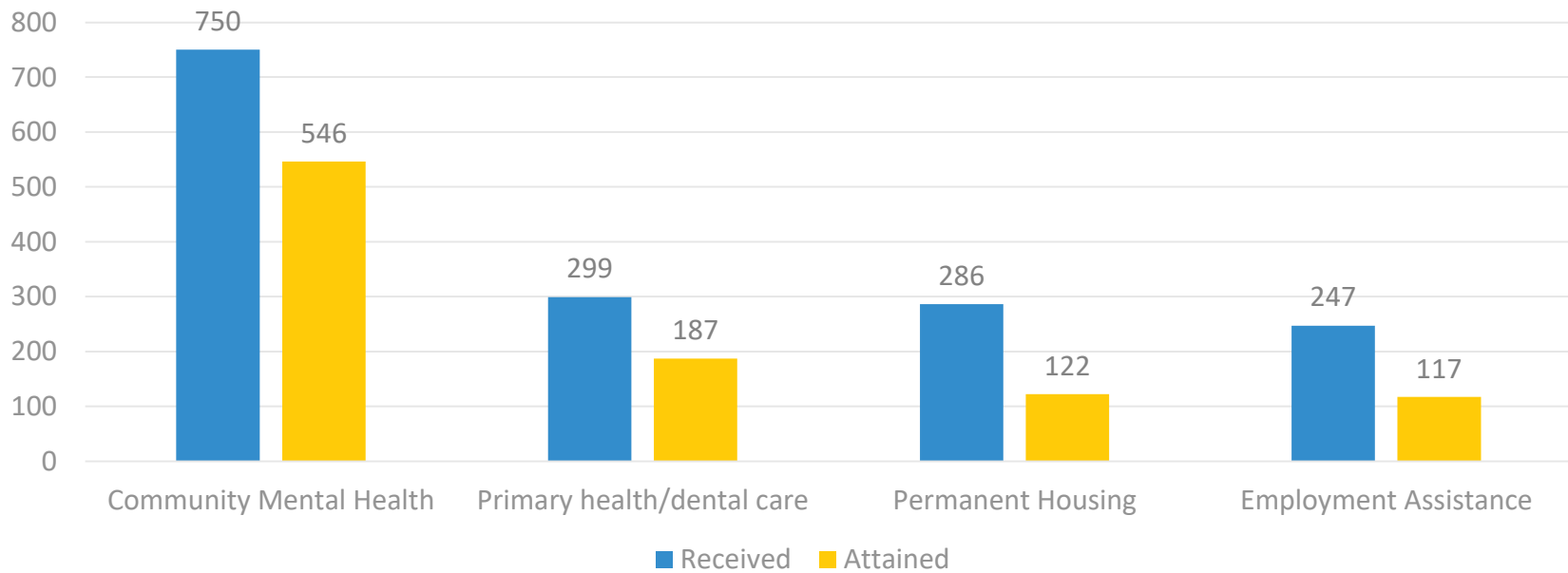

Referrals Provided to Enrolled Clients Attained and Received



This table reports the unduplicated total number of enrolled PATH clients who received a referral for each PATH service and of those receiving a referral, how many attained the service from the referral during the reporting period. Individuals who received more than one type of services are recorded once in all service categories that apply.

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Path Outcomes - Success Stories

- Coconino and Yavapai Counties: Assisted the Flagstaff Police Department and the Northland Family Help Center Crisis Line staff by redirecting persons ejected from the Coconino National Forests during the Rafael Fire that began June 23, 2021. PATH mobilized to ask for public donations of food, water, and hygiene supplies to drop off to those displaced. PATH in Flagstaff reached out to more than 40 local businesses and churches, with 4 responding to assist with potential spaces for vehicles and RVs to park overnight.

Path Outcomes - Success Stories

- Maricopa County: PATH Team encountered the consumer during the COVID pandemic, assisted with placement at high risk Shelter, and enrollment in PATH program. PATH Team continued to work with enrollee for a year determining the best course of treatment, building a healthy professional relationship, while working toward housing that could meet the enrollee's needs. After continuous engagements, enrollee was connected to appropriate housing intervention services where he was able to obtain safe housing.

Path Outcome – Success Stories

- Cochise County: PATH enrollee had dealt with a great deal of trauma in her life and had difficulty interacting with others. The PATH team connected enrollee with housing services and advocated for a housing case manager who understood the impact of extreme trauma. The PATH Team met the housing case manager, explaining some of the enrollee's behaviors. The housing case manager walked into the situation fully understanding the enrollee's needs, where to set boundaries, and when to provide support, and had the enrollee housed within a week without any incidents. She has been successful in the housing program and has since gotten a part-time job.

Path Outcome – Success Stories

- Pima County: PATH Team met a woman with a serious mental illness determination, who was living outside, and had been diagnosed with advanced-stage cancer. She had been unable to seek medical care, as cancer treatment is generally not provided to those living outside due to the associated health risks. She was enrolled in the PATH program, assisted in communicating with her housing navigator, and was quickly matched with a rapid rehousing program. She has moved into permanent housing, is able to access treatment, and is applying for Social Security income.
