


## Getting Aerial View on the Google Maps Website


### Step 1:

Use your web browser to visit Google.com: <https://www.google.com/>




### Step 2:

Click on the “Maps” tab, found on the black ribbon in the upper left side of your screen:




### Step 3:

Use the search box and type in the location you want. A shortlist of possible results will drop down. Click on the location you want, and the map will automatically draw to the location you’ve set:



#### Step 4:


You can zoom in or zoom out by scrolling your mouse or clicking the + or - buttons at the right. You can also drag your mouse across the map to move around:



#### Step 5:

Close out the maps search bar by clicking the "X" shown after your requested address. This will allow you to see more of the map and identify things around your desired location (example: local parks, churches, bus stops, eateries, etc.)

Remember to zoom as needed:




#### Step 6:

Take a screenshot of map by pressing ALT + PrtScn



**Step 7:**

**Open a blank Word Document and paste the screenshot in the document by pressing Ctrl + V**



**Example: With my map I was able to identify a local eatery, several bus stops, banks, a museum, a service station and a elementary school, all in close proximity of my desired location.**

**Tip: Use the satellite feature to get a street view of map.**
