INFORMATION REGARDING COVID-19

In response to Medicaid-related questions from providers and contractors arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, AHCCCS has developed a list of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) Regarding Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) which is updated regularly. It is important to note that there are instances where the information presented in the CMS-approved flexibilities and COVID-19 FAQs does not align with provisions set forth by the AHCCCS Medical Policy Manual (AMPM). In these instances, the CMS-approved flexibilities and FAQs take precedence and are controlling.

NAME CHANGE

Effective April 1, 2021, Comprehensive Medical and Dental Program (CMDP) changed to Comprehensive Health Plan (CHP) due to Behavioral health integration. Refer to Laws 2019, 1st Regular Session. AHCCCS is in the process of revising all pertinent documents to reflect the new name.

CONTRACT NAME CHANGE

Effective October 1, 2022, the Regional Behavioral Health Authority (RBHA) for the Managed Care Organizations was aligned with the Competitive Contract Expansion YH20-0002 to expand the provision of services for the awarded ACC-RBHA Contractors. AHCCCS is in the process of revising all pertinent documents to reflect this change.

AMPM POLICY 320-Z – MEMBERS ON CONDITIONAL RELEASE

AMPM Policy 320-Z is a new policy created to outline expectations of Contractor surrounding members release from Arizona State Hospital (ASH) who must adhere to a conditional release plan under the jurisdiction of the Superior Court. In the past, the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB) held jurisdiction of these members in collaboration with contracted health plans, ASH, and community providers. The PSRB was dissolved by Arizona Senate Bill 1839 (2021), which amended A.R.S. § 11-584 as well as A.R.S. 13-3991 et seq. The policy outlines new responsibilities and expectations of the contractor and community providers. Major policy requirements include verbiage surrounding reporting requirements, member monitoring, and inclusion of required community provider training by the Contractor to ensure knowledge of statutory changes as they apply to the community provider role.

AMPM POLICY 1021 – CONTRACTOR CARE MANAGEMENT

AMPM Policy 1021 was revised to align with Arizona Senate Bill 1839 (2021), which amended A.R.S. § 11-584 as well as A.R.S. 13-3991 et seq. as it relates to the repeal of the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB). Policy was also revised to conform with National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) requirements and annual contract updates. A new reporting requirement for High Cost Behavioral Health with Attachment E was added.
