Dear President Petersen and Speaker Montenegro:

House Bill 2691 requires AHCCCS to annually report the status of Maricopa County Community College District (MCCCD) and Northland Pioneer Community College (NPCC) efforts to expand behavioral health workforce training programs in Maricopa and Navajo Counties.

Specifically, AHCCCS must report the following:

- 1. The number and type of behavioral health programs created at each community college district, including the number and type of programs at each individual community college in the district.
- 2. The number of students supported financially in each program at each individual community college.
- 3. The number of students completing each program by type of program and at each specific community college.

The report is due to be submitted by December 31, 2024. Because final grades for students receiving financial support for the Fall 2024 semester are not available until mid-January, reporting requirement number 3; the number of students completing each program by type of program and at each specific community college are not included in this version of the report. When the final grades are submitted by the faculty to program staff at MCCCD and NPCC and received at AHCCCS, we will amend and resubmit this report to include this data.

The report is organized into three parts.

Section I – MCCCD, Section II, NPCC and Section III, NPCC and MCCCD Summary for 2023 and 2024.

Except for Section III, the report includes data from the spring, summer and fall semesters of 2024. Section III will combine and report data from fall 2023 through fall 2024.

The required data is reported in table form with a brief narrative explanation of each table.

- Table 1 reports the number and type of behavioral health programs created at each community college district in 2024. In MCCCD's case, the table reports the number and type of programs at each individual community college in the district.
- Table 2 reports the number of students supported financially in each behavioral health program. MCCCD data Table 2 reports the number of financially supported students by program and by community college.
- Table 3A reports the total number of students, including financially supported students, who
 were enrolled in each type of behavioral health program. MCCCD data Table 3A reports this data
 by program and by college.

- 1. Seven (7) new behavioral health programs were created at MCCCD and NPCC in 2023 and 2024.
- 2. A total of one thousand and 6 (1,006) students were financially supported by both MCCCD (988) and NPCC (18) in 2023 and 2024.
- 3A. A total of 5,217 students (including financially supported students) were enrolled in 48 total behavioral health programs in 2023 and 2024 (MCCCD 45 programs and NPCC 3 programs).

3B. A total of 122 individual students who received financial support satisfied all coursework requirements in 2023 and 2024.
