Dear President Yarbrough and Speaker Mesnard:

A.R.S. § 41-3955.01, subsection D, requires AHCCCS to submit a report on the status of the Seriously Mentally Ill (SMI) Housing Trust Fund, including a summary of facilities, the cost and location of each facility, and the number of individuals benefiting from operation, construction or renovation of the facilities.

In total, 62 individuals were served by the \$806,702 in SMI Housing Trust Fund monies spent in FY 2018. Table 1 below displays the location of each facility and the associated expenditures by location:

In addition to these funds, an additional \$ 4,364,855 in FY 2018 funding has been allocated for expenditure in FY 2019. ¹ Please note that \$2 million of this is allocated for a low-income housing tax credit project with the Arizona Department of Housing that will break ground in 2018. The remaining funds have been allocated as follows:²

¹ There is an additional \$2.6 million in funding that will be allocated for expenditure in FY 2019. Both the unspent FY 2018 funding and the FY 2019 funding will be included in the FY 2019 report.
